
STEM OPT Extension



Definition and Eligibility

- STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math)
- If your major is on this list, you're eligible for extension of your current OPT for up to 24 months
 - Check your I-20 for the CIP code of your major
- STEM Extension does not come automatically—you must apply and get approved before your 12-month OPT ends
- You must have not accrued more than 90 days of unemployment
- Make sure your employment information is reported to the OIE and is up to date

Two Options for STEM Extension

Option 1: Current Degree (Most common)

- Use the current STEM-eligible degree upon which your 12-month OPT is based
- The job for extension must be related to this degree

Option 2: Prior Degree

- If your current OPT is not based on a non-STEM degree but you have a different degree that is STEM, you're eligible for extension
- The previous degree must be at a lower degree level, and is earned within the past 10 years from a SEVP certified school

Employment Requirement

Employer must be everified

Clear training plan must be created

- Work with your employer to fill out 10983
- Instructions available in the Document Review Request portal

The employeeemployer relationship must be Bonafide

- Employer that pays you and you work for must be who completes your training plan
- Self-employment is not eligible

Working hours must be at least 20 hours/week

 20 hours/week is considered full-time by USCIS

There must be compensation

- Standard payroll
- Housing
- Stipend

Timelines and Dates

- USCIS can accept your STEM OPT Extension application as early as 90 days before the 12-month OPT end date listed on your EAD
- USCIS must receive your STEM OPT Extension application before the
 12-month OPT end date listed on your EAD
- OIE must review your documents and create an I-20 for your application, so do not wait until the last minute!



Application Process

- 1. Student completes the STEM OPT Document Review Request from the OIE website
- OIE will check your documents and help you perfect them
- Usually takes about 2-3 corrections. Follow instructions carefully!
- Takes up to 10 business days to review
- Email <u>caustin4@emporia.edu</u> when you submitted the request
- 2. OIE will make a recommendation for your STEM OPT Extension in SEVIS and issue an OPT I-20
- 3. Student will submit the STEM OPT Extension application on the USCIS's website on their own
- Instructions will be provided with the I-20
- Do not submit the application before receiving the OPT I-20
- May ask Chie to review your online application before submitting—give her several options of your availability when asked
- 4. Wait for approval
- It takes 90 days or sometimes even longer
- If you move before you receive a new EAD card, you must report your new address to USCIS

180-Day Rule

You can continue to work while your STEM OPT application is pending for up to 180 days, as long as you filed on time (before your 12-month OPT end date)



Mandated Employment Reporting

- While on STEM OPT Extension, there are several mandatory reporting requirements
- The SEVP portal will still be open to you, but use it only to report your new address
- Any employment updates should be emailed to the OIE
- Failure to report our employment could cause serious consequences, including losing your visa status



Mandated Employment Reporting Cont.

 You're required to report your employment status to the OIE every 6 months of any change

 Email the OIE and confirm that your information is up to date

6 months

12 months

- Email the OIE and confirm that your information is up to date
- Submit the Evaluation of Student Progress on I-983

 Email the OIE and confirm that your information is up to date

18 months

24 months (last report)

- Email the OIE and confirm that your information is up to date
- Submit the Final Evaluation on Student Progress on I-983

Changes in Employment

End of a job or change to new visa

- Fill out the Self-evaluation of your performance on I-983
- Get a signature of your employer

Start of a new job

• Requires a new I-983

Leave a job and add a job at the same time

- Must submit the Final Evaluation for the previous I-983
- Submit a new I-983 for the new job

Material changes to I-983

- Submit updated I-983 if there are changes on:
- · Salary, EIN, Employer address, Hours worked per week, etc.

Unemployment

- You are given 60 days of unemployment for STEM OPT Extension
- This can be combined with your remainder of your 90-day unemployment from your 12-month OPT
 - For example, if you didn't use any of the unemployment days for your 12-month OPT, then you will have 150 days of unemployment allowed on STEM OPT



International Travel

- You must have the following items for reentering the U.S.
- Most updated I-20 with a travel signature
 - Must have accurate information
 - Request a travel signature <u>here</u>. The process could take up to 3 business days!
- Passport
 - Must be valid more than 6 months into the future
- Proof of employment, such as a paystub
- STEM OPT EAD



Remember

- Submit the Application Document Review in a timely manner so that you won't miss the USCIS's deadline for the STEM OPT Extension
- Email is the preferred method of communication with the OIE
- OIE will not remind you of dates and deadlines
 - It is your responsibility to count unemployment dates, manage deadlines for the application and mandatory employment reports
